### Tuesday, March 22 Workshop: Bridge Inspection QA/QC, Reporting, & Safety

This workshop will provide bridge engineers, bridge designers, and bridge owners a deeper understanding of bridge inspection reporting requirements, including routine reporting requirements, timeliness of inspections and reporting, new reporting requirements, and Scour Action Plan-development, use, and documentation. The morning sessions will provide overviews of quality control/quality assurance, inspection reporting requirements, and risk based inspections.

The second half of the workshop will include non-destructive evaluation, Michigan-bridge updates, and safety issues. In addition, the workshop has a goal of highlighting two research projects, a remote sensing-3D wireless bridge inspection tool, and unmanned aerial vehicles with examples of completed projects using both 3D cameras and infrared technologies. Safety topics include OSHA requirements such as railing height and tie off requirements, bridge inspection planning, job safety analysis, PPE, work plan development, paperwork, reporting, record keeping, working around roadways/railroads/waterways, working above the ground, working in confined spaces, and permit-entry issues.

From the North: US27 S to I69 W, Exit 89 Continue on I69 W toward Charlotte/Ft Wayne. I69 W Merges with I96 E, Take I496 Downtown Lansing, Exit 95, go 1 mile on I496 to Creyts Rd, Exit 1. Left on Creyts Rd, turn right at 1st light, Anacapri Blvd.
