The focus of this course is to reduce those close calls between the workers and the equipment used in transportation organizations. The training will help site workers and supervisors develop and implement Internal Traffic Control Plans (ITCPs), including:

- Understanding the hazards faced by construction workers every day, especially workers on foot
- Learning how to create safe "zones" for workers and equipment to avoid struck-by incidents
- Developing an internal Traffic Control Plan to create safe routes for workers, trucks, and construction equipment

The sessions conclude by looking at Roadway Safety Plus (RS+) software tools that aid in roadway construction safety.
