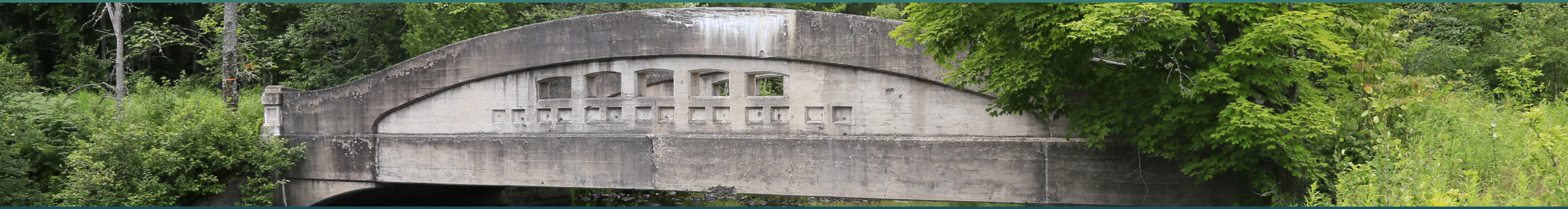


TAMC Bridge Asset Management Training 2019 Webinar & Workshop Series



In the first webinar, participants will be introduced to bridge asset management and will learn about the evaluation of bridge condition and its related needs and maintenance operations. The second webinar will cover cost estimating and optimization of bridge preservation actions; it will also show how these knowledge areas come together in a bridge asset management plan.

The hands-on workshop provides participants with templates and guides them in customizing the templates with agency-specific asset information. Participants will walk away with the tools to complete their own, unique asset management plan and will start drafting their plan during the workshop.
