Updated National Bridge **Inspection Standards** Overview and Q&A

Recent updates to the National Bridge Inspection Standards (NBIS) were announced May 6, 2022. Join MDOT for more details and how changes will affect you.



This updates the existing NBIS relative to the National Bridge Inventory for the first time since 2009. The updated NBIS applies to all structures defined as highway bridges on all public roads, on and off Federal-aid highways, including tribally and federally owned bridges. In addition, the NBIS now applies to private bridges that are connected to a public road on each end.

The webinar will discuss changes that go into effect June 6, 2022 and provide an overview/timeline of changes that take place later. This will be followed by an opportunity to ask questions.
