#### SCHOOL SAFETY

Our future is in our children, so let's protect them.

The Van Buren County Road Commission reminds all drivers to keep these safety tips in mind:

Wait for school buses. Prepare to stop when a slowing bus has its overhead yellow lights flashing, and come to a complete stop when its red lights are flashing and its stop arm has been extended. Proceed with caution when red lights stop flashing and the extended stop sign is withdrawn.

Be alert and ready to stop. Children are not always aware of their surroundings and assume that drivers will stop for them. Youngsters also dart into the road without looking first for traffic.

Allow extra time. Frequent stops that happen during the morning pick-up and afternoon drop-off call for drivers to allow extra time for their week-day commutes.

Slow down. Watch for children walking in the street, especially where there are no sidewalks. Watch for children playing and gathering near bus stops.

"Most importantly," says Larry Hummel, Engineer-Manager of the Van Buren County Road Commission, "educate your children about school safety. Walk the route to and from school with your children, and find out beforehand if there will be crossing guards at intersections. If they are riding a bike or scooter, make sure they know and obey the traffic laws and wear proper safety equipment. And if your child will be taking the bus, instruct them to arrive at the stop early, stay out of the street while waiting, and always keep themselves visible to the bus driver." The Van Buren County Road Commission wants you to know . . .

During the winter months, the Van Buren County Road Commission performs many duties, but snow and ice control are the most noticeable. When you consider the working conditions, including visibility and traffic, they are probably the most dangerous. That's why it is very important for residents, especially children, and newly licensed drivers, to know what they can do to help snow plow operators.

- Don't build snow forts, make tunnels, or play in or on snow banks next to roads.
- Keep well away from the edge of the roadway as you wait for the school bus, get the mail, or watch the plow trucks.
- Stay away from the end of a driveway when a snow plow is approaching.
- Keep sleds and toys away from the roadways at all times.
- Keep garbage cans up in the driveway if it snows on garbage collection day.
- Wear your seatbelt and always allow extra time to reach your destination especially on snowy days.
- Don't attempt to pass a snow plow vehicle while they're plowing.
- Plow drivers have limited visibility and they cannot see directly behind their trucks. Plus, plows can suddenly move sideways from hitting drifts or by cutting through packed snow. Motorists are advised not to travel next to a plow.
- Don't crowd the plow!



Yesterday the newest member of our office staff had the chance to ride along with a plow driver for part of the day. Here's what she had to say about the experience:

"After only 2 years of being at the Road Commission, I still consider myself a 'rookie'. I learn new things each season and see a bit more of the 'bigger picture' each time. Yesterday was one of the days where I learned A LOT as I was able to ride along with one of our plow drivers. While I have a bit of experience riding along with my husband in his semi and have respect for the men and women who operate huge trucks in general, I wasn't prepared for being in that snow plow. The gentleman I rode with is a true professional.

In the dark morning with very little visibility, we were off and plowing. Snow was blowing up over the hood of the truck and I am so glad I was not the one behind the wheel... I would not have been able to find the road! (Check out some of the videos posted for a look at this.) I learned just how much these guys have to focus on while driving—it is far more than I ever considered! While he is "just driving" he is also controlling all the blades (there are 3 on his truck), the amount of material he is spreading, keeping an eye out for the roadway to be sure he's where he should be, looking ahead for stranded/stuck vehicles, and making sure to steer clear of people out shoveling their driveways, keeping track of their equipment for any mechanical issues, and much more. It is so much to think about and keep track of!!

Not only did I learn about the daily tasks of these drivers as they plow, but I also got a glimpse of the pride he takes in his work—he is plowing roads so people can travel safely and he realizes the great importance of this. Roads are opened up, widened, and maintained by this seasoned veteran during each snow event in Van Buren County and we are lucky to have dedicated, professional snow plow drivers like him! I left my experience yesterday with a renewed respect and admiration of these drivers. They do so much more than they receive credit for and they do it in a crazy stressful environment. I challenge each of you to consider this as we continue into our wonderful Michigan winter."
