MiWaters

On August 17, 2015, the DEQ's Water Resources Division (WRD) launched a new information system called MiWaters. MiWaters is a state-of-the-art, comprehensive, Web-based permitting and compliance database. The system replaces over 25 applications and databases currently used by the WRD, some of which are over 30 years old.



MiWaters establishes a streamlined electronic permitting process, allowing Michigan to fulfill federal electronic reporting requirements and providing an online component for access to public information. The focus of MiWaters is permitting and compliance, including National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES), storm water, groundwater discharge, aquatic nuisance control, Part 41 construction, and land and water interface permits. It also includes electronic reporting of untreated or partially treated sanitary ...







Creating a MiWaters account will allow you to manage interactions with the DEQ Water Quality Program. You'll be able to:

- Submit an application for a permit
- Change your permit (transfer, renewal, or modifications)
- Submit reports required by your permit including Discharge Monitoring Reports (DMRs) and other scheduled or unscheduled submittals

Certifier Agreement Form

Certain types of forms and reports, particularly those administered under the federal NPDES program, require that the user submit a Certifier Agreement Form that must be approved by the department before these forms and reports can be submitted.

 - Contact the facility directly and ask the designated MiWaters account administrator to invite you to join the site.
 - **Enter a Verification Code** provided by mail from DEQ
 - If the site does not currently have an active account manager, contact MiWaters support to learn how to set up a site account.

If your facility, project or site has not yet had DEQ involvement, your site will be created after you **fill out and submit an application or service request** form and DEQ has begun processing it.





This Joint Permit Application should be used by Public Transportation Agencies that are eligible to receive Act 51 transportation funds where the project is for the construction, maintenance, or improvement of a public transportation facility. Agencies and projects that fall in this category are not required to submit an application fee except when the project was found to be in violation of not having obtained a valid permit



- On August 17, 2015, the DEQ's Water Resources Division (WRD) launched a new information system called MiWaters. MiWaters is a state-of-the-art, comprehensive, Web-based permitting and compliance database. The system replaces over 25 applications and databases currently used by the WRD, some of which are over 30 years old.



MiWaters establishes a streamlined electronic permitting process, allowing Michigan to fulfill federal electronic reporting requirements and providing an online component for access to public information. The focus of MiWaters is permitting and compliance, including National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES), storm water, groundwater discharge, aquatic nuisance control, Part 41 construction, and land and water interface permits. It also includes electronic reporting of untreated or partially treated sanitary ...
